Your Excellency:

I have the great honor to acknowledge with deep gratitude your kindness in providing two fellowships for students of Georgetown University for study in Universities in Germany. This is a particularly gratifying expression of your friendship, in that, first of all, it manifests that encouragement of student exchange in our respective countries which is mutually desirable; and in the young men who shall avail themselves of this opportunity there will be a long-lasting evidence of the spirit of esteem and good will now happily obtaining between our University and the people of Germany.

I am informed by our Director of Scholarships, who has been administering these Fellowships for Georgetown that the awards have been made to Miss Kathleen Heffernan, graduate of our Foreign Service School, who will study International Affairs at the University of Munich; and to Mr. Florentine Calabria, of the College of Arts and Sciences, who will study Comparative Literature, probably also at Munich.

It is our sincere hope that these and others of our students who have studied in Germany through the kindness of the government at Bonn, may be the future ambassadors of continued and increasing understanding and cooperation between our two countries. There is no surer foundation or stronger guarantee for the peace of the world. From this Your Excellency may know how much we at Georgetown value and appreciate this latest act of kindness.
