

M e m o r a n d u m

Re: Visit of Rev. Brian A. McGrath, S.J., Vice President of
Georgetown University, and
Dean Paul R. Dean, Georgetown University Law Center

July 2 - July 6, 1964

Father McGrath and Dean Dean discussed with us the following three topics:

1. The permanent connection between the Frankfurt Institut für ausländisches und internationales Wirtschaftsrecht on the one side and Georgetown University on the other side.
2. The cooperation between the Frankfurt Institute and Georgetown University in the so-called "cartel study" undertaken at present in Frankfurt.
3. The exchange of American, German and Swiss students in connection with 1) and 2) as well as outside of these programs.

The basis of our discussions were three reports on the present activities of the Frankfurt Institute:

1. "The so-called cartel study": The factual national practice of cartels in Belgium, France, Great Britain, Italy, The Netherlands, Switzerland and Germany and its impact on their legal institutions and on the political and sociological background of each nation involved.
2. On international cartel as a legal entity.
3. On the problems of evaluation of enterprises under American and German laws.

Each of the reports indicated clearly to which extent American materials and experiences had been used in the work of the Institute as well to which extent a further coordination of American studies with the corresponding studies here is necessary.

The following points of understanding have been considered and are going to be submitted for final decision:

1. As to permanent connection:

Georgetown University is going to submit by end of August a final proposal to the Frankfurt Institute. Georgetown University is willing to maintain a permanent Institute under the name of the present Georgetown Institute.

Furthermore, a permanent secretary and an American assistant and the necessary room and technical help will be available. Georgetown is going to continue to use their P-number system to enable German scholars and assistants selected by the Frankfurt Institute to come to Washington and to work in the Institute. Whenever either by Frankfurt alone or by both universities a special study shall be undertaken, a special direction of the project shall be appointed.

The Schulte zur Hausen exchange scholars will remain available to the research work of Frankfurt.

On the other side Frankfurt will give Georgetown scholars corresponding possibilities.

2. Immediately beginning budget year July 1, 1964 Georgetown University and the Frankfurt Institute are going to reach an agreement in accordance to which an American cartel study parallel to the Frankfurt cartel study is to be undertaken. Furthermore, eventually American material necessary in connection with the Frankfurt study will be put at the disposal of Frankfurt.

For this purpose it is agreed that for the year 1964/65 the attached budget now presented for the Institute in the Law School will be dedicated to the above mentioned projects. The Dean of the Law Center will agree to the participation of the Law School in this project and to the utilization of

the present Institute for this purpose. Furthermore, if ever possible some of the members of Georgetown University Faculties shall be invited to cooperate.

It is intended to present the same budget for 1965/66 if necessary. As an extra fund Mr. Schulte zur Hausen gave Georgetown a gift of \$ 10,000 for the expressed purpose to promote the joint work of the Frankfurt Institute and Georgetown. The detailed utilization of these \$ 10,000 has to be agreed on.

3. In 196~~4~~65 there will only be one American exchange student in Germany (Brian Carney) and one research scholar in the United States (Dr. Rummer). The remaining \$ 10,000 will be put at the disposal of the Washington Institute to cover its expenses including the expenses to make the cartel study in America effective.

X It has been agreed that this program shall be executed in the following way: Georgetown will submit its suggestion for the permanent plan end of August while Frankfurt will present the cartel study about the same time.

It has been agreed that in the middle of September a meeting of the board of advisors of the Washington Institute at which Father McGrath and Dean Dean are going to report about our negotiations and our new agreements will take place.
