Dear Guenther:

Thank you for your kind letter of March 30. I very much look forward to addressing your seminar on May 11. Professor Mosler has in fact written Dr. Kronstein to invite me to lecture in Heidelberg on May 10, and I have written him today. The topic of our separation of powers in foreign affairs is a large one; I thought that I might address different aspects in each of my talks, e.g., the war area in one and possibly the commerce area in the other. From prior experience, I have concluded that one should not try to cover too much in a talk; I would of course be happy to answer such questions as I can with respect to the entire area. I do not know how much time I should allow for my talk but will assume about one hour, unless you suggest otherwise. I hope my speaking in English will not be too inconvenient.
